Wild and Scenic: The Natural and Cultural Importance of the Agua Fria River - Free

- What: One of the natural wonders of central Arizona is in Black Canyon City's backyard. Learn about the outstanding natural, cultural, historical, and scenic values of Agua Fria River and the Agua Fria National Monument. Speaker will be Dr. Connie Stone who worked at the Arizona Bureau of Land Management for more than 24 years as an archaeologist, land use planner, and assistant field manager. More ...




Keep the Watershed Safe, It's Your Grandchildren's Future

- When: Sunday, June 2, 2 to 3:30 PM
- Location: Old Cañon School Museum, <u>33955 S.</u> Old Black Canyon Hwy, Black Canyon City

What: Guest speakers Ms. Kathryn Geyer, Hydrologist with Yavapai County Flood Control District and Mr. Tony Angueria, Flood Warning Specialist will provide a holistic overview of the Agua Fria watershed, emphasizing the location of Black Canyon City at the confluence of two major tributaries within the watershed. Ms. Geyer will use a model to demonstrate how upstream development, if done irresponsibly, can directly impact the health of the watershed and lead to massive pollution and flooding downstream. Following the demonstration, Mr. Angueria will explain the extensive Flood Warning System that has been emplaced within the Agua Fria watershed, specifically to protect Black Canyon City from flash floods/dangerous water levels.
