Hooded Mergansers are lovely little diving ducks that are usually seen in pairs or small flocks. They nest in cavities near small ponds or marshes.

They're especially fond of wooded swamps. In winter, they are found on calm bodies of water. Have you seen one at our park?

This week's Bird of the Week: Cactus Wren

While the female is incubating on clutch of eggs, the male wren builds another nest. This nest will be used or a second clutch of eggs as the parents may rear several broods of young in one year.
